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ACMG Foundation Receives Funding from Pfizer for Clinical Genetics Training Residencies/Fellowships

Bethesda, MD – **June 14, 2016** | The ACMG Foundation for Genetic and Genomic Medicine (www.acmgfoundation.org) announced that it has received a \$165,000 commitment from Pfizer to provide funding for education and training in clinical genetics in the form of fellowship grants for 2017-2019.

The **ACMG Foundation/Pfizer Clinical Genetics Training Fellowship Award** will provide funding for the salary and research of fellows selected by the ACMG Foundation.
