Catherine A. Ziats, MD Receives 2021 ACMG Foundation/ David L. Rimoin Inspiring Excellence Award

BETHESDA, MD – April 14, 2021 | The ACMG Foundation for Genetic and Genomic Medicine is proud to present the **ACMG Foundation/David L. Rimoin Inspiring Excellence Award** to Catherine A. Ziats, MD for her platform presentation, "Alterations in respiratory epithelial gene *SPDEF* segregate with severe disease in a family with variable response to COVID-19 infection."

Dr. Ziats is in her second year of Medical Genetics training at the Greenwood Genetic Center in Greenwood, SC. She completed her medical school training at the University of Florida and her internship at the University of Michigan. She has had a longtime interest in adult and pediatric neurological disorders and her research has focused on neurodevelopmental disorders.

"We are pleased to recognize Dr. Ziats as this year's David L. Rimoin Inspiring Excellence Award winner. Training and mentorship were key cornerstones of Dr. Rimoin's career and we are proud to honor his legacy in making this award to an accomplished genetics trainee," said Bruce R. The David L. Rimoin Inspiring Excellence Award was created in memory of the late Dr. David L. Rimoin, one of the founders of the American College of Medical Genetics and Genomics (ACMG) who died in 2012. Dr. Rimoin touched the lives of generations of patients as well as trainees and colleagues. The award is a cash award given to a selected student, trainee or junior faculty ACMG member whose abstract submission was chosen for a platform presentation to be given at the ACMG Annual Clinical Genetics Meeting.

Upon receiving the award, Dr. Ziats said, "I am very honored and grateful to have received the prestigious David. L Rimoin Inspiring Excellence Award and for the recognition by the ACMG. Importantly, I am extremely grateful to the family members who agreed to participate in this study, who despite their difficult time found it important to attempt to advance our knowledge on host genetic factors associated with severe COVID-19 infection. I am also very grateful for the support and training I have received at the Greenwood Genetic Center, and for the help and collaboration of other GGC researchers who helped with this project. To help promote further similar endeavors and ongoing work, I intend to donate the award money to the Greenwood Genetic Center Foundation."
